the Forest section in the Natural Resources chapter. The

Commission compared the new draft language related to Act 171 with the current language and looked at the BioFinder maps. Snellling observed that the BioFinder maps show that most of Townshend is either Highest Priority or Priority Forest Blocks. Unlike other areas of the State, Townshend doesn't currently have a problem with forest fragmentation. The plan language and policies will need to focus on practices that conserve the existing

large tracts, especially the central ridge lines.

Town Hall: DeSiervo reported that he had scheduled a meeting on Friday morning with architect Mark Thaler, to quote on preparing the plans and bid specs for the Town Hall work.

Snelling noted that Evans told him that Peter Welch from Cotton

Associates is scheduled for Friday afternoon.

<u>State Park bridge:</u> Matschke informed the Commission that he had spoken with the Dept. of Parks and they will be rebuilding

the bridge for the Bald Mountain trail.
